NOTES OF THE CAWS COMMITTEE MEETING - WEDNESDAY 5th MARCH 2025

The Community Action: Whitley & Shaw (CAWS) committee met at the Head Shed at 7pm.

1. Welcome / Present /Apologies

Peter welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Peter notified the meeting that Ann Harrison has resigned from the committee

4. MWPC Grant Application – Peter

Peter advised that the amount granted to CAWS by MWPC was £2250, £906 less than the submitted application amount. Joan advised that with this amount, the bank account now has a balance of £4190 (CEG has £1788).

For CAWS, the reduced amount received means that it is not possible to do everything on the list which was as follows:

- Community gallery (phone box in Shaw) £2436.00
- Insurance £481.54
- Picnic table £239.00

Mike queried the cost of the community gallery and agreed to investigate further to see if this could be done cheaper. Peter will send the quotes on to him. It is possible that the quote from Arien Signs Ltd could be made cheaper by collecting and fitting the display cases ourselves. ACTION: Mike and Peter

With regard to the insurance, Peter suggested that Joan shop around at renewal (September) and suggested she speak with the treasurers form other local groups such as Bowerhill Residents Action Group and Berryfield and Semington Residents Action Group. ACTION: Joan

Lesley S agreed to research the cost of the picnic table for Evergreen Meadow. She will speak with her husband as he has contacts at Timber Tack and will also check prices on line. Peter will let Mike and Leila know that this activity is underway. ACTION: Lesley S and Peter

Peter advised that there were some 40 or so organisations present at the meeting to receive cheques from MWPC and it is very apparent just how much volunteering activity is happening in the area. In addition to CAWS, from Whitley and Shaw the following all received funding:

- Shaw Village Hall
- Whitley Stores
- CEG
- Gardening Club

5. BESS and cable route (to include key themes of the planned CAWS submission) update - Peter

Peter provided an update including the following points:

- We now know the battery site will not be in Whitley.
- The consultation period is 29th January to 19th March and the submission from CAWS must be in before the end of it.
- The Working Group focus is now on the cable route (which needs to connect to the Melksham substation). The Group are going to set out its agreement with the decision to deselect Whitley for the BESS to ensure all of the information is in the public domain and with the planning inspectorate. This will then be on record should it ever be required in the future.
- Wiltshire Council has now formally decided to oppose the scheme.
- The exact cable route is not known but the Working Group are advising Lime Down Solar (LDS) of things that need to be avoided, e.g. Octavian, the disused quarry, the reservoir, the Roman road and Wansdyke etc.
- It has been confirmed that LDS does not intend to go under any private gardens.
- LDS will be asked to explore a more direct route for the cabling, from Gastard straight down to the substation rather than via Whitley.
- With regard to the engineering solution, the Group will playback information regarding things such as the depth of trenches, cable sealing ends, temporary construction compound etc.
- The Group will also make sure LDS do not exacerbate the flood risk, biodiversity, heritage etc.
- There is a requirement for LDS to plan to undertake the necessary works for the cable run professionally and to minimise impact on local residents i.e. working between 08:30am and 4:30pm, Monday to Friday only and no working at weekends or bank holidays.
- There will also be a requirement to keep CAWS informed of progress/developments.
- Peter is asking LDS for circa £375k towards community benefits such as flood alleviation, renewable energy (e.g. solar panels for Whitley Stores, Shaw Village Hall, Shaw school), a residential energy scheme for LDS to allow residents to take advantage of their buying power to buy such equipment at a discount, and for community engagement. Although this is being requested it is not known how LDS may respond.

6. Safeguarding Register - Dan

Dan confirmed that only two people still need to sign the register.

Peter advised on behalf of Kirsty that she met Claire Hall from Whitley Stores and they are both to do the Safeguarding training.

7. Litter pick/SVH storage container spring clean – Lesley S/Mike/Peter

It was confirmed this is arranged for 6th April, 1pm meet at Shaw Village Hall. Mike will develop a plan/schedule for the day and will post this on Facebook, on the WhatsApp group for CAWS members and in the village shop. Dan agreed to bring his van as transport. ACTION: Mike

8. Potholes – Peter/Dan

Dan advised that the big pothole at the end of First Lane on to Top Lane has been fixed (after more than 15 years!). It transpires a pipe underneath had collapsed and there is still concern that this may impact the join to the gulley by the shop. Also, the outside of the repair is not sealed so Dan will talk to his contact about this. ACTION: Dan

The footpath from Middle Lane going north along the Corsham Road will be repaired in the new financial year.

The MyWilts app has been upgraded and users should delete the old app and reinstall the new one.

9. Summer Events – Peter
