- (c) Mike has spoken to a couple of local artists and he will also approach the new head of Shaw school. Melksham News would like to promote the gallery (when it is "open"), and Peter will follow up on his initial discussion with the leader of the Art club.

Mike talked to the publisher of the Guiness Book of Records, to see if we could be added as the "smallest gallery in the world", but there is a fee of £10,000 for being recorded, so that was dismissed as an idea.
